

1 Learning Program

IPB University fosters a learning environment that integrates principles of justice, peace, and practical engagement with society through various innovative programs. The Natural Resource Learning, Justice, and Peace course delves into the role of natural resources in conflict and security, offering students both theoretical and empirical insights. Focusing on cases such as Poso, Maluku, Aceh, and Papua, students explore how natural resources influence conflict dynamics and peace-building, equipping them with a nuanced perspective on resourcebased conflict resolution.

In alignment with these goals, IPB implements case-method and team-based project learning in over 1.543 courses. This approach, prevalent in fields like social sciences, law, and agriculture, fosters critical thinking and empathy as students analyze real-world issues surrounding social justice and public policy. Meanwhile, the EduTransform program supports the Merdeka Belajar Kampus Merdeka (MBKM) initiative by involving students in partner villages and small business development, enabling them to apply their knowledge to improve community well-being and develop sustainable solutions.

Finally, the **Praktisi Mengajar program** bridges academia and industry, with IPB lecturers collaborating with 68 practitioners to provide students hands-on insights into professional ethics, conflict management, and social responsibility. Through these programs, IPB University prepares students to become proactive leaders committed to building equitable, peaceful, and inclusive communities.


2 Research and Innovation

The mission of education, research and community engagement continues to be strengthened through various international and local collaborations. The Data Desa Presisi (DDP) team recently handed over precise data collection outputs from Padana Kedeper and Penembang Villages to Central Bengkulu Regency, supporting village development through datadriven decision-making. On the global stage, IPB University students shone at the Kyoto **University International** Symposium in Vietnam, winning poster awards and strengthening academic partnerships across Asia.

Furthering its influence in food security, IPB University, alongside Kasetsart University, co-founded the **ASEAN Network for Sustainable** Food Systems, aiming to address food security challenges across ASEAN nations. Additionally, through partnerships like that with Malaysia's Perak Food **Security** Academy, IPB University expands research and service in sustainable agriculture, a key to resilience in food systems. In vocational education, a new **MoU** with Chuo Joho Institute in Japan introduces a "3+2" joint program, aligning Indonesian education with Japanese job market needs. IPB also showcased its **Agromaritime 4.0** concept during the FiSAED conference, underscoring its commitment to sustainable agromaritime solutions that contribute to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



IPB University's initiatives extend into social finance and regional development. FEM Dean Dr. Irfan Syaugi Beik met with Thailand's Parliament Speaker to discuss the growth of zakat and waqf in Southeast Asia, fostering collaborations in Islamic finance. Locally, the Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Science (FPIK) and the University of Mataram's faculties have teamed up to advance fisheries and marine science in West Nusa Tenggara, promoting education and community empowerment in the region. These partnerships illustrate IPB University's dedication to fostering impactful, sustainable development both in Indonesia and abroad.



3 Campus Operation

Various initiatives have been launched to improve governance, social resilience, and operational efficiency, marking progressive steps in public service delivery and community engagement. A notable effort is the **Integrity Zone Development** initiative, unveiled at the Andi Hakim Nasution Auditorium, aiming to establish a Corruption-Free Zone (WBK) and a Clean and Serving Bureaucratic Zone (WBBM) across faculties and schools by next year. Vice-Rector Dr. Alim Setiawan Slamet underscored IPB's commitment to an anticorruption culture and high standards of governance, supported by a broad digital transformation.



In tandem with its governance efforts, IPB University's Ministry of Social and Political Affairs, BEM KM, held a Women's Forum webinar on family resilience. Addressing the challenges families face in the modern era, the forum highlighted the roles of Gen Z and family harmony in building resilience. With input from family experts and active participant engagement, the webinar reaffirmed family as a cornerstone of societal stability.

On the operational side, IPB University has formalized a collaboration with PT Bank Mandiri, focusing on payroll services for non-civil servants, benefiting both permanent and contract employees. This partnership, led by Dr. Alim Setiawan Slamet, also explores opportunities in research and student entrepreneurship, further strengthening IPB University's financial and resource infrastructure for sustainable growth.

Community Engagement

Through the **Kedai Reka Matching Fund 2023** program, lecturers from IPB
University's Vocational School (SV)
offered Village Information
Transparency System (SIKD) training to
officials in Cibunian Village, Pamijahan,
Bogor. Led by Uding Sastrawan, SP, MSi,
the training aims to boost transparency
using digital tools, impacting village
administration, economy, social life,
and culture across several partner
villages.

Meanwhile, the Faculty of Economics and Management (FEM) and national organizations hosted a year-end discussion titled "Reflection on the Dynamics of the Nation's Journey 2023 and 2024 Projections." This hybrid event, held at IPB's Dramaga Campus, addressed national challenges and the upcoming leadership transition in 2024, aligning with IPB University's mission to contribute to national progress.

In another initiative, FEM faculty provided farmers in Mbay,
Nagekeo Regency, East Nusa
Tenggara, with insights on financing options for agriculture.
Prof. Firdaus and his team educated farmers on funding sources such as self-financing, cooperatives, and KUR loans, offering solutions to access

agricultural practices, which underscores IPB University's commitment to advancing rural economic resilience.
