Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls

1 Learning Program

IPB University demonstrated its commitment to gender equality through various initiatives involving education and the empowerment of women. The Faculty of Human Ecology (FEMA) offered courses such as **Gender and Family** and **Gender and Development**, aimed at raising students' awareness of gender issues in the context of family welfare and community development.

Additionally, the Faculty of Economics and Management (FEM) participated in organizing the **Gender Workshop** during the ECOGIV Annual Meeting, where academics from various countries shared experiences and strategies to support women's careers towards leadership positions. Another initiative supporting gender equality was the **Nutrition Counseling** held by faculty and students from the Vocational School in Cibitung Wetan Village, Bogor Regency. This activity focused on health education for pregnant women regarding proper nutrition to prevent stunting. By providing knowledge that could enhance the well-being of mothers and children, this activity empowered women in the community and positively impacted their families.

The Dharma Wanita Persatuan (DWP) of IPB University also contributed to supporting gender equality by organizing a talk show titled DWP Insight, which discussed the role of women in preventing

gender-based violence in higher education. By involving various partners, this event not only raised awareness of the importance of a safe learning environment but also empowered women to guide and protect their communities from violence and inequality. These efforts were interconnected and reflected IPB University's commitment to achieving gender equality across various sectors.

2 Research and Innovation

Several research initiatives to support gender equality were conducted in various fields. One of these was the launch of the social innovation **Rumah Sawit** led by the Gender and Children Studies Center (PKGA). This initiative aimed to fulfill the rights of women and children in the palm oil sector by providing integrated services in education, health, and training. The Rumah Sawit model was implemented in three provinces: Lampung, Central Kalimantan, and North Sumatra. Additionally, four researchers from the Coastal and Marine Resource Studies Center (PKSPL) participated in the **Gender Equality and Social Inclusion Training (GESI)**. This training was aimed at identifying the root causes of gender inequality in the fisheries sector, which had long been considered a male-dominated field. By enhancing participants' understanding of the importance of applying GESI principles, it was hoped

that the resulting research would be more inclusive and responsive to gender issues.

During the #iEMPOWER 'Women Drive: A Way Forward in Halal Economy' event, **Dr. Nancy Dewi Yuliana** from IPB University emphasized the crucial role of women in the halal economy sector as a driver of global economic growth. She explained that Indonesian women contributed over 64 percent to SMEs in the halal food and Muslim fashion sectors, and government support in facilitating halal certification and enhancing financial literacy further strengthened women's positions in this sector. Through these various activities, IPB University made tangible contributions to gender equality and the empowerment of

all students. Additionally, IPB University had the **Center for Gender and Child Studies (PKGA)**, which focused on gender-responsive development, particularly in empowering women and protecting children. Through activities such as research data documentation, seminars, and workshops, PKGA educated the community about the importance of gender mainstreaming in development, both on campus and beyond.

IPB University also provided child-friendly facilities like Agriananda Childcare and Maternity Care to support mothers in pursuing education and/or careers. With comfortable maternity facilities and maternity/paternity leave for staff, IPB University created an inclusive environment that facilitated women's ability to balance family and professional responsibilities. All of these initiatives reflected IPB University's efforts to promote gender equality and support the well-being of women and children on campus.

3 Campus Operation

The university demonstrated a strong commitment to gender equality through the establishment of the Sexual Violence Prevention and Handling Task Force (**Satgas PPKS**), which aimed to prevent and address sexual violence on campus. Satgas PPKS was established to raise awareness and provide appropriate responses to every report of gender-based violence, ensuring a safe and supportive campus environment for

training for incarcerated mothers to enhance their self-confidence and parenting skills, enabling them to fulfill their roles as better mothers. In an effort to improve women's economic skills, programs such as the **CASTIK (Cassava Stick) food innovation** in Bunar Village and training on making tea from nutmeg peel for Women's Farmer Groups (KWT) in Nagrak Selatan Village empowered housewives to create business opportunities by utilizing local resources. Furthermore, educational activities on stunting prevention and balanced nutrition through the **POS LIGA (Posyandu Peduli dan Siaga)** program also involved women in family health decision-making, strengthening their roles in the community.

Another notable program is the **Quality Family School** program to enhance parents' understanding, especially mothers, regarding child development and character education. By educating women about **investing in children's education**, this program aimed to increase access to education for girls and empower parents' roles in supporting child development. Meanwhile, the education program for members of the **Women's Farmer Groups (KWT)** on processing household waste into economically valuable products provided crucial knowledge to enhance women's economic independence in the community.

Through initiatives such as the **Prefriendtion** program, which encouraged teenagers' awareness of sexual and gender health issues, as well as **socialization** efforts by the PPKO Himasilkan Team that supported marketing strategies for mothers' business groups in Rancabungur Village, IPB University sought to empower women to contribute more to social and economic development. These activities were interconnected in the effort to reduce gender inequality, increase women's participation in various sectors, and create a more inclusive environment in society.
