




Learning Program

One of the key international initiatives was the Visiting Professor program organized by the Department of Community Nutrition, which hosted Assoc. Prof. Wannee Jirapakkul from Kasetsart University, Thailand. This program enriched academic insights in community nutrition and strengthened IPB's international academic health network.

further establishing IPB's position in global research related to sustainable food and health.

At the national level, IPB University has actively built partnerships to support innovation in healthcare services and medical education. The Veterinary Teaching Hospital (RSHP) at IPB collaborated with Hermina Central Hospital to develop **kidney transplant services for humans**, starting with training on pig kidney transplantation as a preclinical model.







Furthermore, IPB hosted a public lecture titled "The Future of Medicine" delivered by Indonesia's Minister of Health, Budi Gunadi Sadikin, which highlighted the transformation of the national healthcare system and emphasized the importance of cross-sector collaboration in modern healthcare delivery. As part of its 61st anniversary, IPB also signed a cooperation agreement with RSUD Cibinong and the Indonesian Heart Foundation (Bogor Branch), covering health education initiatives, medical check-up discounts for retired staff, and organizing heart-health exercise programs on the Dramaga campus.

Local partnerships have also been a key focus of IPB University in enhancing community health. collaboration with the Bogor Government, IPB implemented **the** Marriage School Program, aimed at preventing stunting through education for prospective couples about the importance of reproductive health and preconception nutrition.



In another effort, IPB, along with the IPB Alumni Humanitarian Volunteer Group (ARM HA-IPB), provided free healthcare services to:

Research and Innovation

Lecturers **IPB** University consistently at demonstrate outstanding achievements research and innovation. Several focusing on health and wellbeing include research conducted by **Dr Yessie** and teams from the Department of Physics, Department of Chemistry, Tropical Biopharmaca Research Center, and the School of Business, which developed an innovative toothpaste made from temu oil and eggshell, named the oral care product "C et Chic".



In addition, **Prof. Dyah Iswantini** developed a herbal slimming product called Prolislim, made from two Indonesian medicinal plants — tamarind slices (Garcinia atroviridis) and white turmeric (Kaempferia angustifolia).



Meanwhile, **Prof. Irzaman** and his team created a non-invasive hemoglobin (Hb) measuring device named Tesena Non-Invasive HB Check, which uses light to analyze Hb levels without the need for a blood sample; this innovation was developed in collaboration with the National Research and Innovation Agency and PT Tesena Inovindo.

Campus Operation

IPB University consistently supports the health and well-being of its academic community through responsive campus operations. IPB has a **health unit** accessible to students, staff, and the general public from Monday to Saturday, with operating hours from 8 AM to 8 PM, and on Saturdays until 6 PM.

Community Engagement

Throughout 2024, IPB University demonstrated a strong commitment to achieving SDG 3 (Good and Well-being) through community engagement programs focused on improving access to healthcare services, public health education, and cross-sectoral collaboration. These initiatives included free services for disaster-affected residents in Cileuksa Village in partnership with IPB's alumni.

In addition, Community services in nutrition education under the theme "Isi Piringku" conducted by vocational school students at SDN 9 Bantarjati, to raise awareness about balanced diets and prevent stunting and obesity among children.



IPB also participated in the **World Rabies Day 2024** by offering free pet vaccinations in collaboration with the Bogor City Food and Agriculture Office (DKPP) and the Indonesian Veterinary Medical Association (PDHI) West Java II. Furthermore, IPB implemented **a female cat sterilization program** to help control the stray cat population and reduce the risk of zoonotic disease transmission.

Sekolah Keluarga Berkualitas

IPB University implements the Sekolah Keluarga Berkualitas (SKB) Program to reduce stunting, enhance family financial literacy, strengthen family relationships, and improve maternal and child health. Through collaboration with village governments and local cadres, the program conducts mentoring, training, and public seminars, culminating in a graduation ceremony. In 2023, SKB graduated 75 mothers, and in 2024, 197 mothers from Sukabumi Regency and villages around the IPB campus.



Student Activities

In 2024, students of IPB University have actively contributed to improving community health through systematic and impactful outreach programs. For example, the Marine Science and Technology Student Association organized a Mobile Health Check activity at the Mangrove Jaya Posyandu in Pantai Mekar Village, Muara Gembong District. This initiative, in collaboration with local health centers and community health posts, involved monitoring the weight and height of numerous toddlers in areas frequently affected by tidal flooding.

Additionally, students from IPB Vocational School conducted a health education campaign titled Resilient Teens: Prevent Anemia Risk at SMP Negeri 2 Bogor. The program aimed to raise adolescents' awareness about anemia and promote healthy lifestyle habits. Furthermore, the Geophysics and Meteorology Student Association collaborated with the local community in Cibunian Village to hold a seminar and free health check-up, targeting the prevention of stunting among mothers and children through balanced nutrition education and regular health monitoring.
