### **Learning Program**

IPB University demonstrated its commitment to gender equality through various initiatives involving education and the empowerment of women. The Faculty of Human Ecology (FEMA) offered courses such as **Gender and Family and Gender and Development**, aimed at raising students' awareness of gender issues in the context of family welfare and community development.

Complementing this effort, the Institute of Science and Technology Area (LKST) organized a Workshop and Focus Group Discussion on Mainstreaming attended representatives from various university units. The event highlighted IPB's progress promoting inclusivity—where about 30% of innovators supported by LKST are women—and recommendations strategic produced strengthen gender-responsive education, inclusive infrastructure, and protection against gender-based violence on campus. These initiatives demonstrate IPB University's ongoing commitment to integrating gender perspectives into education, research, and innovation.



In alignment with this commitment, the Department of Community Nutrition at FEMA organized the **7th IPB Nutrition Summer Course 2024**, themed "Maternal and Child Nutrition Programs in Indonesia."



The five-day program convened national and international experts to exchange knowledge on child improving maternal and emphasizing the central role of women in promoting family health and food security. Through lectures, discussions, and field visits to community-based nutrition initiatives such as Rumah Tempe Indonesia and Serambi Botani, program fostered gender-sensitive education approaches nutrition to community empowerment. This initiative exemplified IPB University's continuous efforts to integrate gender perspectives across education, research, community and engagement, thereby contributing to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 5 on gender equality.

### **Research and Innovation**

Through the Center for Coastal and Marine Resources Studies (PKSPL), IPB University has advanced gender equality in research and innovation by recognizing the pivotal role of women in coastal communities. Under the FOCUS (Fisherfolk Empowerment for Climate Resilience and Sustainability) program, PKSPL collaborated with Puspita Bahari, a women-led fisherfolk organization in Demak Regency, to promote women's legal and social recognition as fishers, their ownership of fishing assets, and their participation in sustainable coastal management.

By integrating gender perspectives into research and community engagement, this initiative not only enhanced women's economic resilience and environmental awareness but also positioned them as central agents in fostering inclusive and climate-resilient coastal societies.

IPB University further reinforced its commitment to gender equality through research-driven policy initiatives. The Institute for Science and Technology Area (LKST) organized a Workshop and Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on Gender Mainstreaming to evaluate and strengthen gender-responsive strategies in higher education, engaging:

reflecting IPB's growing inclusivity in innovation. The event featured key experts, including Dra. Eko Novi Ariyanti, RD, representative of the Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection (KPPPA); Dr. Titik Sumarti, lecturer at the Faculty of Human Ecology (FEMA) IPB University and gender expert; and Titik Rahmawati, M.Ag, gender specialist from the Center for Gender and Child Studies

(PSGA), State Islamic University (UIN) Semarang. Their insights emphasized the importance of institutional transformation toward gender equity, resulting in strategic recommendations to strengthen gendersensitive policies, infrastructure, and protection mechanisms across the university.

student level, IPB University's commitment to gender-responsive innovation was reflected in the development of Femony Yoghurt, a functional food product designed to support women's reproductive health. This student-led research integrated science, nutrition, and gender awareness to address menstrual health challenges through sustainable and accessible nutrition-based solutions. With its probiotic formulation aimed at promoting hormonal balance and reproductive well-being, Femony Yoghurt exemplifies how IPB empowers young researchers to contribute meaningfully to women's health and the broader goals of gender equality.

### **Campus Operation**

University demonstrated its strong commitment to gender equality through the establishment of the Task Force for the Prevention and Handling of Sexual Violence (Satgas PPKS), which works to prevent and respond to cases of sexual violence within the campus community. The task force raises awareness, provides appropriate responses to reports of gender-based violence, and ensures a safe and supportive environment for all students and staff. In collaboration with the National Commission on Violence Against Women (Komnas Perempuan), Satgas PPKS organized a public campaign titled "End Violence Against Women, Make Campus Safe" at the Dramaga Campus to commemorate the National Day Against Violence, highlighting the importance of victim protection, gender equality, and institutional accountability.



Alongside Satgas PPKS, IPB University also operates the Center for Gender and Child Studies (PKGA), which promotes genderdevelopment, empowerment, and child protection through research, seminars, and community outreach. The university further supports inclusivity by child-friendly facilities such Agriananda Childcare and Maternity Care, as well as maternity and paternity leave for staff. These initiatives collectively strengthen genderresponsive governance and demonstrate IPB University's dedication to advancing SDG 5 (Gender Equality).

# **Community Engagement**



The Center for Coastal and Marine Resources Studies (PKSPL) of IPB University, through the **Fisherfolk Empowerment** for Climate Resilience and Sustainability (FOCUS) program, conducted a community engagement visit to Demak Regency, Central Java, in collaboration with several partner foundations. The activity included an interaction with Puspita Bahari, a women-led fisherfolk organization recognized nationally for its efforts in promoting gender equality and environmental awareness in coastal communities. Comprising over 130 female fishers, the organization advocates for women's recognition and rights in the fisheries sector. PKSPL highlighted Puspita Bahari as a model of inclusive coastal empowerment, demonstrating how women can play key roles in economic independence, creative enterprise, and ecological awareness. This collaboration resilience strengthens community supporting IPB University's commitment to gender equality and sustainable coastal development.

Similarly, through the Tani and Nelayan Center (TNC), IPB University amplified the voices of women farmers in climate adaptation efforts during the 2024 National Farmers' Day Reflection.

Collaborating with The Nature Conservancy Indonesia, this initiative provided a platform for women farmers to share experiences, discuss challenges, and develop strategies for sustainable agriculture and climate resilience. The discussions emphasized the critical role of women in building environmentally conscious farming systems and contributing to food security. By supporting women's leadership and capacity building in rural communities, IPB University continues to advance gender equality through inclusive engagement that empowers women as agents of change in both coastal and agricultural sectors.



#### **Student Activity**

Students of IPB University, through the Student Creativity Program in Community Service (PKM-PM), initiated the Srikandi Sejati - program to empower women living with HIV in the Bogor area. Conducted under the supervision of Dr. Nur Islamiah from the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences, this program aimed to strengthen self-confidence and develop a growth mindset among female HIV survivors. Collaborating with the Sahabat Ibu, Remaja, dan Anak Foundation, the students implemented the **ACTORS** framework-covering Authority, Confidence Competence, Opportunities, Responsibility, and Supportinteractive activities discussions, journaling, and reflection sessions. The initiative helped participants overcome stigma and discrimination while encouraging peer-to-peer empowerment among women living with HIV. This student-led project exemplifies IPB University's commitment to gender equality and social inclusion through community-based action and education.



Through the Sangga Harmoni program under Capacity Student Organization Strengthening Program (PPK Ormawa) Himaiko IPB University, students collaborated with the Association of Women Heads of Families (PEKKA) to empower women entrepreneurs in rural areas. The program focused on improving financial literacy, developing home-based businesses, strengthening women's leadership capacity within their communities. Ву combining mentoring, training, and social innovation, Sangga Harmoni enabled women heads of families to build economic independence and social resilience. This student-driven initiative demonstrates IPB University's dedication to fostering gender equality through youth-led empowerment and community engagement.
